Summary Of Public Participation Section

Opened 19:30

a) Report from Unitary Councillor.

Cllr James Sheppard was in attendance.

Cllr James Shepherd (Wiltshire Council) – Update on Budget, Highways and Fire Service

Cllr Shepherd addressed the Council to provide an update on Wiltshire Council’s current position. He advised that the most recent budget-setting process had been particularly challenging, noting that the administration’s proposed budget was narrowly defeated by one vote. However, a number of its proposals were subsequently incorporated into the final agreed budget.

He outlined the ongoing financial pressures facing the Council, with approximately 80% of expenditure committed to statutory services, including a significant proportion allocated to adult social care. Although the highways budget remains substantial at around £48 million, this represents a slight reduction on previous years, and reduced government funding continues to impact the Council’s ability to deliver services.

In respect of highways maintenance, Cllr Shepherd reported that the Council continues to prioritise pothole repairs, although longer-term solutions such as full resurfacing are preferred where resources allow. He highlighted that recent severe weather conditions have led to a significant deterioration in road surfaces, particularly in rural areas. Residents were encouraged to report defects using the [MyWilts](#) app to ensure issues are recorded and prioritised appropriately.



Cllr Shepherd acknowledged concerns regarding disruption from roadworks and utility works. He explained that the Council has limited control over statutory undertakers but is exploring options to incentivise more efficient working, including the potential introduction of daily road occupation charges. He also noted that emergency works cannot be scheduled and often contribute to disruption.

An update was also provided regarding the proposed closure of the Royal Wootton Bassett fire station, which is currently out to consultation, with a decision expected in June. Cllr Shepherd advised that neighbouring stations, particularly in Swindon, provide rapid response times and already attend a proportion of incidents in the area. Despite recognising the valued role of the local station, he noted that financial savings requirements are necessitating difficult decisions.

Cllr Shepherd further responded to questions regarding highways maintenance priorities and roadworks coordination, explaining that prioritisation is based on factors such as defect severity and road classification. He confirmed that, whilst enforcement mechanisms exist, current arrangements often allow statutory undertakers considerable flexibility in the timing of works.

The Chair thanked Cllr Shepherd for the update.
